The show features entrepreneurs seeking funding from a panel of investors, in exchange for

a percentage of their businesses. One of the investors is Mark Cuban, the Dallas Mavericks basketball team owner, who offered Lazarri \$100,000 for a 33 percent stake in her business. The business did \$600,000 in sales — 20,000 orders — in three days after the episode aired. Simple Sugars produces 36 body scrubs, five facial scrubs, three vegan scrubs and one foot scrub for women, and a men's line called Smooth for Men with nine products.

Lazzari, who dealt with eczema and skin problems, started making scrubs from ingredients in her family's kitchen, and giving them as gifts. Though her pitch on "Shark Tank" might have been the most important of her short career, it wasn't the first. As a junior at her high school, Lazzari said she convinced school administrators to create an independent work program so she could run her business and attend class via Skype. Her classmates were jealous, she said, but they didn't realize what the business entailed.

"They all thought I was sitting home watching TV all day," Lazzari said. "Meanwhile, I was probably working more than they were. I've definitely had my fair share of obstacles to overcome, being so young and trying to get people to take me seriously," she said. Even after her appearance on "Shark Tank," Lazzari said, some acquaintances don't realize how Simple Sugars has grown. "People think I'm doing it in my kitchen and selling it to friends," she said. Lazzari graduated from high school this year. She was accepted to George Washington University in Washington, D.C., but has put college on hold to focus on her business.
